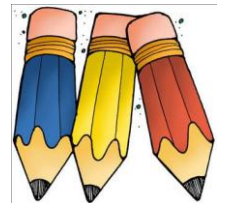

Campbell Stone Memorial Residence

Campbell Stone Memorial Residence, located at 1295 Race St, Denver, is a senior housing project that was founded in 1959 to provide low cost housing to retired Disciples of Christ ministers and members. It's mission has been expanded to include anyone needing low cost housing.

CSMR is a 6 floor high rise apartment building, and includes studio, one and two bedroom units. Rents are well below market, at \$365 for studio, \$460 for one bedroom, and \$552 for two bedroom. Rent includes all utilities except telephones and cable. A rooftop antenna provides access to free over the air television broadcasts, including the major networks. The property is owned by Denver area Disciples of Christ churches. It is overseen by a board of directors, which according to the bylaws should be made up of a majority of Disciples members. New board members are elected by the board, to a three year term. The board meets the second Thursday of every other month. Disciple members are encouraged to attend board meetings, and volunteer to serve on the board. Ken Smith and David Bishop currently represent Harvey Park Christian Church.

The board has contracted with Ross Management Company to manage the building. Tours can be arranged by contacting the building manager at 303-321-0878. Also, if you know of anyone who may be interested in renting a unit, have them contact the building manager for information.
